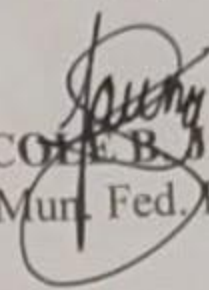


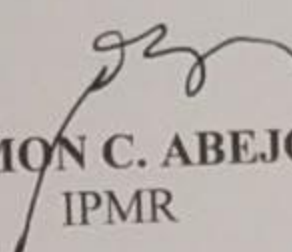


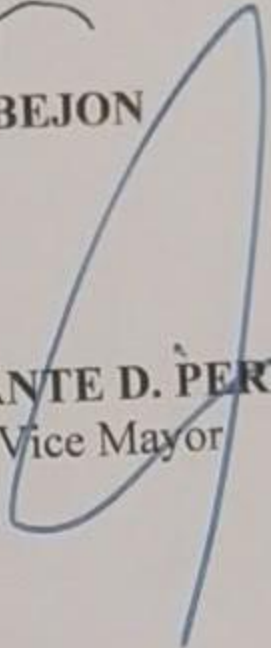

Whereas, the initial damage based on the assessment report from the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office and Municipal Health Office indicates widespread displacement and public health risks, including:

1. 610 families or 1,705 individuals were forced to evacuate to temporary shelters
2. Proactive health interventions requiring the distribution of 370 capsules of doxycycline to 100 individuals to prevent leptospirosis and waterborne infections

Whereas, the storm caused catastrophic damages to the following infrastructure facilities which pose an ongoing threat to life and property if left unaddressed:

Whereas, the local agricultural sector suffered heavily, recording an estimated P2,703,301.87 in agricultural damages, severely undermining the livelihood of local farmers and fishermen and threatening local food security;

Whereas, in a letter dated August 11, 2026, the Local Chief Executive of Botolan formally requested the Sangguniang Bayan to pass a resolution declaring the Municipality of Botolan under a state of calamity due to the adverse effects and damages brought by Tropical Storm "Maymay";

Whereas, the Sangguniang Bayan after due consideration of the Mayor's request, the situational reports submitted by the concerned municipal offices, and the circumstances prevailing in the Municipality, finds the extent and magnitude of the damages caused by the said storm warrant the declaration of Botolan under a state of calamity;

Whereas, pursuant to Republic Act No. 10121, the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, the declaration of a state of calamity by the Sangguniang Bayan allows the municipal government to immediately access and utilize the Quick Response Fund (QRF) under the Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund (LDRRMF) for relief, rehabilitation and recovery operations;

Whereas, under Republic Act No. 7581, the Price Act, as amended, the declaration of a state of calamity automatically triggers a price freeze on basic necessities, prime commodities and fuel products within the territorial jurisdiction of the municipality to prevent price gouging and assist affected residents;

Now therefore, upon motion of Hon. Dr. Fernando D. Igrobay, seconded by Hon. Eddie D. Daos, and approved by all the members of the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled:

Be it resolved, as it is hereby resolved, to declare the Municipality of Botolan, Zambales under a state of calamity due to the devastating effects of severe Tropical Storm "Maymay".

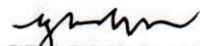
Resolved further, to authorize Hon. Jun Omar C. Ebdane, Municipal Mayor, and relevant local government offices, to utilize the Quick Response Fund (QRF) and other available resources for immediate relief, medical response, temporary shelter support, and infrastructure recovery operations.

Resolved furthermore, to strictly enforce a price freeze on all basic commodities, prime necessities and fuel products throughout the Municipality of Botolan while the state of calamity remains in effect, strictly directing the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) local office and municipal monitoring teams to enforce compliance.

Resolved finally, that copies of this resolution be furnished to all concerned agencies, for their information and appropriate action.

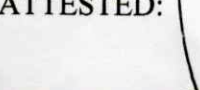
